FROM THE RABBI: SEEING THE UNIVERSE END TO END

there to be light in the world without the sun?

Our commentators mention that the light of the first day was so bright, one could see from end of the universe to the other. God then saw that there would be wicked people in the world who might abuse such ability, so he took the light of the first day and hid it for the righteous in the next world.

According to an ancient midrash, the first man, Adam, had the ability to “see from one end of the universe to the other.” Another midrash mentions that Adam’s stature “reached up to the heavens.”

Over the years I’ve been puzzled by these statements. Just recently, in the course of my studies, I felt that I might have an insight; which I would like to share with you.

In listening to a lesson over a “Podcast,” the teacher who was discussing this passage made the following observation: The reason why we don’t see from one end of the universe to the other has to do with our *gashmiyut*, that is, the physical aspect of our nature as humans.

What struck me at that moment related to what I had shared with the congregation the previous *Shabbas* morning. One reason why we get caught making “foolish” decisions, in

In the course of Creation as mentioned in Genesis, Chapter One, “Light” is created on the very first day. However the sun, moon and stars aren’t created until the **fourth** day! How is it possible for following our impulses, is our failure to “look ahead,” to see the consequences of our obsessions. Our desire to satisfy our appetites is so strong that we ignore what to others may appear very obvious. It may involve satisfying personal desires at the cost of one’s family. It may even involve the desire to make war for the sake of personal ambition.

Any of these kinds of behaviors fail to consider sufficiently the chain of cause and effect. Did Hitler ever dream of the toll of human suffering that he would wreak upon the world when he planned his “Thousand Year Reich?” How much did he care?!

“Seeing from one end of the universe to the other” means the ability to understand these chains of causality all the way to their logical conclusion. To the degree that we are subject to our material needs and impulses it’s impossible for us to do this.

As to the statement about “Adam’s height stretching up to the heavens,” it occurs to me that this is talking about Adam’s concern for his fellow creatures and the world around them. Again, our own natural instinct is toward self-preservation; for example, in a situation of conflict we don’t seem to be capable of seeing the other person’s point of view. Understanding someone’s point of view doesn’t mean that one necessarily agrees with them, but it helps tremendously in developing some kind of strategy to solve problems. I believe that it’s of vital importance to understand even one’s enemies!

“Standing as tall as the heavens” refers to the infinite concern Adam had for all those around him. To this day, a person who has this level of compassion is someone who “stands tall among others!”

David is a graphic artist currently working for Hans Weiman and also freelancing. He graduated from Ladue High School in 1996 and from Columbia College in Chicago in 2001. David is the son of Fred Blumenthal, our BSKI Music Maven, and Linda Blumenthal, former cantor of Temple Israel, so that David’s beautiful baritone voice should be no surprise—he has the right parents. After you have spent time with David he establishes himself as a unique personality and you no longer think of him as Fred Blumenthal’s son. He also serves on the board for the Ehlers-Danos Foundation—Ehlers-Danos Syndrome is a group of connective tissue disorders.

Judge Goldenhersh was born in East St. Louis and attended Agudas Achim in East St. Louis which merged with Beth Israel in 1986. He attended Washington University for his bachelors and law degree and has a Masters of Law from the University of Virginia. His wife Barbara also attended WU. Barbara, who passed away in June of 2011, was a Ph.D in Education. Her credentials equal those of her husband: BA, MA and PhD. Barbara’s family attended Chesed Shel Emeth. The Goldenhersh family had two children, Andrew and Stephanie, and belonged to the merged synagogue in Belleville, IL. At that time there were no Sunday School facilities there, so an agreement was made with BSKI for the children to attend Sunday School here (a forerunner of Shaare Shalom). The children were carpooled to BSKI on Sundays and thus, a BSKI connection was formed. Richard Goldenhersh now belongs to two synagogues, BSKI and Augdas Achim-Beth Israel in Belleville, IL, one on each side of the river.

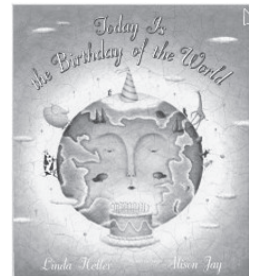

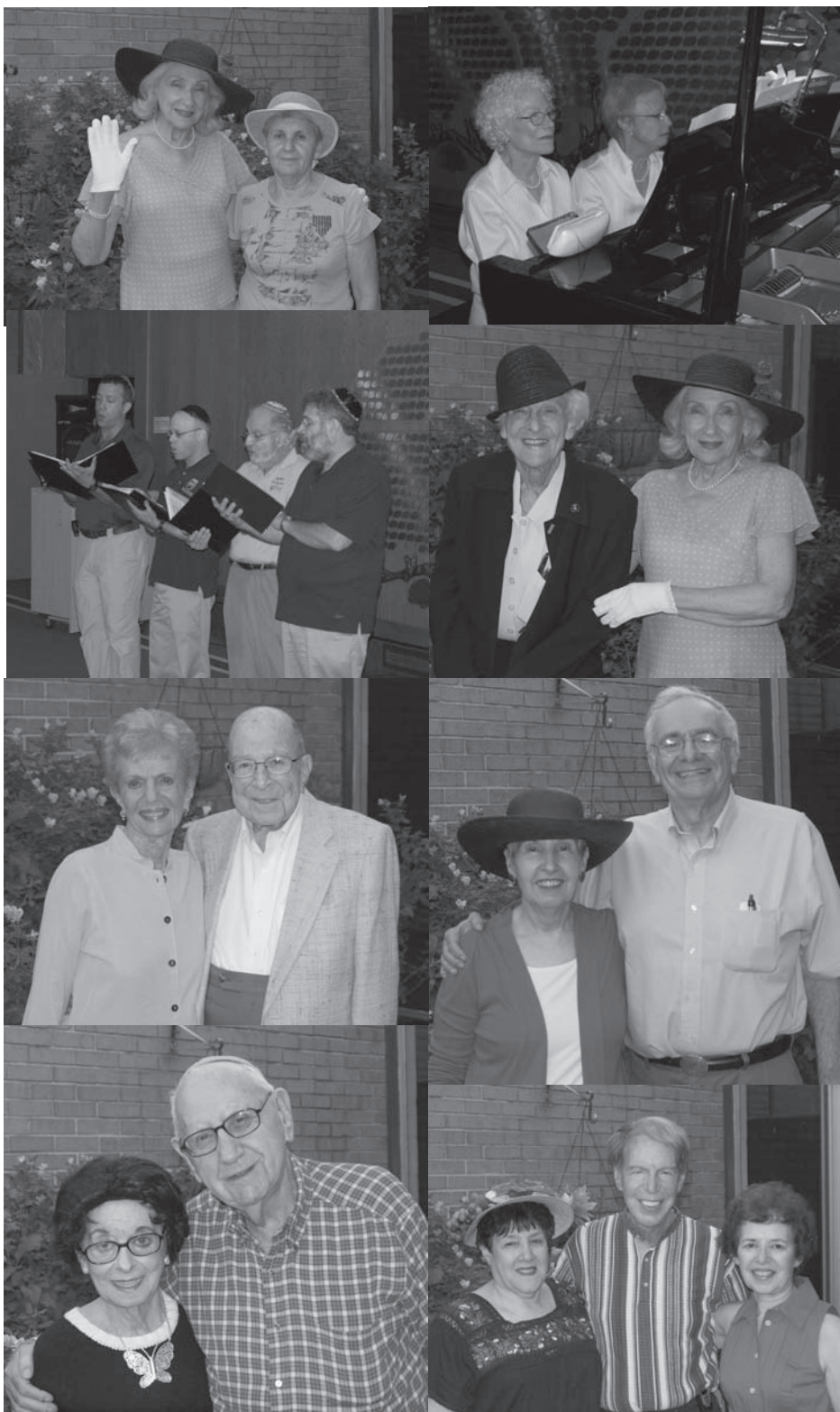
WOMEN'S LEAGUE NEWS
